





- 2. When the water boils, it bubbles, because water gets converted into water vapour. The water vapour is light hence it boils when heated.
 - When milk boils, it rises and spills because the upper layer of milk is covered with cream. Therefore, due to the thick layer on top when the milk below is heated it rises.
- 3. When warm air rises, it expands and cools. Cool air cannot hold much water vapour as warm air, so some of the vapour condenses onto tiny pieces of dust floating in the air. When many such dust particles come together, they form a cloud.
- 4. The days are shorter in the winter and longer in summer because half of the earth gets more sunlight than the other half. In summer, the northern, part of the earth tilts towards the sun making the days longer.
